DEATHS

DURGIN-John H. "Jack" Durgin, Jr., passed away peacefully at his home in Kingston, Massachusetts, on March 19, 2000. Born on September 7, 1924, he was the son of Ethel Solis Durgin and John Harold Durgin of Hopdale, Massachusetts. He was educated in Hopdale schools and graduated as Valedictorian of his class. He went on to earn a Civil Engineering degree at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York. While at Rensselaer, Jack commanded the Naval ROTC, then opted to join the United States Marine Corps. He saw service twice, first in China from 1945 to 1947, and again at Parris Island, South Carolina, and Little Creek, Virginia, from 1950 to 1952. Mr. Durgin began his working career with Plymouth Cordage Company and traveled extensively in the position of Engineer. He then worked for W.R. Grace before accepting a position with Artisan Industries in Waltham, where he rose to the position of Vice President. The city of Waltham held special importance to Jack. He belonged to its Chamber of Commerce, presided over that organization in 1979, and was honored with the Community Involvement Award in 1986. He was actively involved with the Charles River Museum of Industry from its inception, and performed as its President for many years. He belonged to the Waltham Vocational High School Advisory Committee. He also was on the Board of Directors of the Waltham Savings Bank, was a Director of the Fleet Bank. Mr. Durgin was a Director of the American Association of Industrial Management, and lectured at universities and forums on industrial policy. He was interviewed by major publications on the subject of Co-operative education. Jack's life was dedicated to major education. Locally, he was elected to the service of the Silver Lake Regional School Board as its chairman. He also served as a member of the Kingston Boy Scouts, and was named in honor of Girl Scout because of his tireless fundraising efforts for that organization. He also belonged to Jordan Hospital's Board of Directors. In 1999 he celebrated 50 years of membership in the Plymouth Marine Lodge. Mr. Durgin leaves behind his beloved wife, Frances Walliet Durgin, and three children, Jennifer, Amy, and Mark. He is also survived by his brother, Herbert Solis Durgin of Port Orange, Florida, a nephew, grand-nephew, and several cousins.
